3. A \$75.00 annual registration fee must also accompany this application.

Incomplete applications or applications with incorrect funds will be returned.


In addition to the programs that were mentioned in last year's letter we have implemented a few new programs with the horses at Cross Paw Foundation.

With regard to the deworming program; we have been performing individual fecal parasite egg count exams to determine which horses are in need of deworming and not deworming horses that are free of parasites.

We have initiated a program for the older arthritic horses. This program is designed to improve joint fluid by giving Legend (Hyaluronic acid) I.V. injections and Polysulfatedglycosaminoglycan I.M. injections at regular intervals. They also are receiving Duralactin (Mycrolactin) which is a natural anti-inflammatory with glucosamine added.

There are a few horses that have been tested and found to have hypothyroidism. These horses are receiving thyroid medicine.
