<p><b>Definitions</b></p>	<p>REGULATED GROWER - A person who acquires or purchases pesticides or contracts for the application of pesticides to agricultural commodities or onto an agricultural establishment, as a part of the person's normal course of employment or activity as an owner, lessee, sublessee, sharecropper, or manager of the land to which the pesticide is applied.</p>	<p>PEST CONTROL ADVISOR - Any individual licensed by the Department who, as a requirement of, or incidental to, the individual's employment or occupation: (1) Offers a written recommendation to a regulated grower or to any public or private agency concerning the control of any agricultural pest; (2) Claims to be an authority or general advisor on any agricultural pest or pest condition; (3) Claims to be an authority or general advisor to a regulated grower on any agricultural pest.</p>	<p>APPLICATOR - Any individual who applies, or causes to have applied, any pesticide on an agricultural establishment.</p>
<p><b>License Categories</b></p>	<p>Regulated Grower Permit (PGP) Farm Manager / Supervisor (FMS) <b>Special Note:</b> The license number for this category will always be a five (5) digit number.</p>	<p>Pest Control Advisor (PCA) Pest Control Advisor - Exempt (PCE) <b>Special Note:</b> The license number for this category will always be a four (4) digit number.</p>	<p>Agricultural Aircraft Pilot (AAP). <p><b>Form 1080</b></p>	<p>A Pesticide Control Advisor (PCA) <u>or</u> Regulated Grower (PGP) shall enter the required information in writing on a Form 1080, and provide a copy to the Custom Applicator before each pesticide application.  <a href="https://agriculture.az.gov/sites/default/files/1080.pdf">Form 1080: https://agriculture.az.gov/sites/default/files/1080.pdf</a></p>		<p>Before an application, the custom applicator shall not apply a pesticide unless the custom applicator has received a signed copy of the recommendation from the PCA or grower as indicated on the Form 1080.</p>
	<p>Regulated growers shall submit 1080's to the Arizona Department of Agriculture (ADA) for soil applied applications of pesticide containing an active ingredient on the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) Groundwater Protection List:  <a href="https://agriculture.az.gov/sites/default/files/2013gwpl.pdf">https://agriculture.az.gov/sites/default/files/2013gwpl.pdf</a></p>	<p>Before the application of a pesticide recommended by a PCA, the PCA shall notify the regulated grower of the scheduled application date.</p>	<p><del>After completing the application, the custom applicator shall sign the Pesticide Application Report portion of the Form 1080, verifying the pesticide was applied according to the recommendation, as well as noting the date(s) and time(s), equipment tag numbers, credential number of the applicators and any deviations from the instructions.</del></p>
	<p>Some regulated growers use the Form 1080 at their central posting location to notify workers on their establishments of when and where pesticides are to be applied, and the restricted entry interval (REI) or time period within which workers may not enter the treated areas. Under the WPS a regulated grower is required to warn workers about pesticide applications on their establishment, and provide basic protections until 30 days after the expiration of the REI.</p>		<p>Custom applicators are required to submit completed Form 1080's by mail or fax no later than the Thursday following the calendar week in which the application was completed.</p>
			<p>Under WPS exchange of information requirements, a custom applicator is required to notify a regulated grower of the date and time an application was made. If a custom applicator deviates from the date indicated on the Form 1080, the custom applicator must notify the grower to ensure the grower notifies his employees of the REI in the treated areas, and posts the information at the central posting location.</p>
