

Dairy Cattle Entry Requirements

All Dairy Cattle Entering Arizona need:

Entry Permit Number

- Issued by calling 602-542-4293 or emailing CVI@azda.gov
- 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mon to Fri AZ Time
- Valid for 30 days
- Contains a "D" and includes month, year, and an assigned series of numbers

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI)

- Issued by a Category II Accredited Veterinarian
- Valid for 30 days
- Paper CVIs must have an original veterinarian signature
- All Official IDs must be listed on CVI or as an attachment

Official Identification

- Dairy Steers: Federal Ear Tag all ages
- Cows/Heifers: Orange Bangs Tag or Federal Ear Tag with Brucellosis Vaccination Tattoo all ages
- Bulls: Federal Ear Tag all ages
- Calves: Federal Ear Tag all ages



Specific Disease Testing Requirements

Tuberculosis:

 All Dairy Cattle over 4 months of age must be tested for Tuberculosis within 60 days prior to entry into Arizona

Brucellosis

- All female dairy cattle over 4 months of age MUST be official calfhood vaccinates (OCV) for Brucellosis.
- The Brucellosis Vaccination Tattoo must be listed on the CVI
- Brucellosis testing is not required for dairy cattle coming from a Brucellosis Class Free / Level I state

Trichomonas (Trich)

- All Dairy Bulls 12 months of age and older and NOT consigned directly to a dairy must test negative for Trichomonas
- Sample collected by an Accredited Veterinarian and submitted to an approved lab: One negative PCR test within
 days prior to shipment. Bulls must have no breeding activity from test date until arrival
- Official Federal ear tag identification is required on all bulls older than 12 months of age requiring an official Trich test
